

REGULAR MEETING
MARCH 17, 2026

The regular meeting of the Long Lake Board of Supervisors was called to order at 5:30 p.m. by Chair David Johnson. Present were: Supervisors Thomas Malloy and Mark Olson, Treasurer Virginia Smart, Deputy Clerk Lisa Olson and Clerk Patsy Olson. Also present were: Dale Spaulding, Ronald and Judy Rardin. The pledge of allegiance was given.

Motion by M. Olson, seconded by Malloy and carried to approve the minutes of the February meeting as presented. Motion by Malloy to approve the treasurer's report, subject to audit. Seconded by Olson and carried.

Jory Danielson, CWC gave a presentation about a parcel of land between County roads 117 and 25 that is owned by Crow Wing Power. Due to redistricting in 2022, that now becomes another congressional district. He has approached both the city and Crow Wing Power about annexing this into the city. If not annexed, this would be another voting precinct, ballots etc. The Supervisors support the property being annexed into the city. Mr. Danielson will move forward on approaching the city and Crow Wing Power.

Bids for road contract: Use the same information as the last notice. Change Class 5 as price pre yard delivered. Bids will be opened on April 28 at 6:00 p.m. This will be a 2 year contract.

Date for the April meeting was changed to Tuesday April 28th, instead of April 21.

Spring Short Course: Olson will drive, leaving at 7:00 a.m.

Motion made by Johnson to apply calcium chloride to the same roads as last year: Racine, 100th. Street and 70th. Street. Motion seconded by Malloy and carried.

Sourcewell: We are waiting for an estimate from Darwin Hanson for computer upgrades.

Brookside Beach: Clerk has not received anything back from Our Gang Trust.

The clerk will contact Morgans to see if they have filed the new transfer agreement.

Vinyard Estates: The clerk has received a permit application for the driveway, but there was not a check enclosed. Clerk to notify them that the culvert needs to be 16 inches in diameter per township road specifications and that a deposit must be made even if they furnish the culvert.
