

REGULAR MEETING

May 19, 2026

The regular meeting of the Long Lake Board of Supervisors was called to order at 5:30 p.m. by Chair David Johnson. Present were: Supervisors Thomas Malloy and Mark Olson, Treasurer Virginia Smart, Deputy Clerk Lisa Olson and Clerk Patsy Olson. Also present were: James Rollie, Ron Rardin, Susan Howell, Deb Andvik, Dave Bear, Larry and Beth Witckush, Bryan Bresnhan and Dennis Sander. Pledge of allegiance was given.

Motion by M. Olson and seconded by Malloy and carried to approve the minutes as presented. Motion by Malloy and seconded by M. Olson and carried to approve the treasurer's report, subject to audit.

Mogensen Shores Road: Options to redo the road were: micro surfacing at \$38,000.00, doing an overlay at \$122,380.00 and a complete redo at \$181,120.00. Special assessments process was discussed. Johnson to contact the MAT attorney for information. Also discussed possible speed sign. Supervisors will check if possible to rent a portable sign for a few days.

Road inspection report was discussed. The board will send Holmwig a list of what they wanted done each. First to do: pothole and crack filling. Remove brush and down trees from ditches. Grading to be done approximately every 4 weeks depending on moisture. Motion by Johnson, seconded by Olson and carried to approve the report.

Clerk reported that there has been a problem with the toilet. Motion by Johnson, seconded by Olson and carried to purchase a new toilet.

Cemetery computer program: Rardin has found a program titled Crypt Keeper that would keep the records. It could be done online at a cost of \$120.00 per year or a charge of \$250. for a computer program. This could be accessed by the public to find out what lots were available. Motion by Olson, second by Johnson and carried to purchase the online version.

Olson reported that he had a call from Lonny Murray, Oak Lawn Township Road supervisor. He stated that the Vineyard Estates development needs to install silt fence to the driveways to prevent washing dirt onto Butternut Road.

Olson reported that beavers were working by Thompson Road and he has contacted DNR for beaver permit.

Lake Ave. James Rollie again questioned the survey done on Lake Ave. He had a map that stated came for CWC Planning and Zoning showing where the road was vacated. He had been told earlier that he needed a survey showing that the one done by JLD was incorrect. He stated that he could not get a surveyor to do a survey. He was informed that he needed

to remove everything from the platted road or they would be removed on Wednesday May 27 and he would be charged the cost.

Sourcewell: They will have funding for a comp. plan update after 7/25/26. He has not heard from Region 5.

I PADS: Johnson can update for Deputy Clerk and Mark Olson.

Brookside Beach: After reviewing the map, the board decided not to proceed with vacating the road.

Correspondence was discussed.
